

Are we all descended from a real-life Adam and Eve? Was the Bible's great flood really a memory of the end of the Ice Age? Steve Jones, Britain's most highly-respected geneticist, Emeritus Professor of Genetics at University College London and 1991 BBC Reith Lecturer, explores the shared mysteries of faith and science, and suggests viewing the Bible - 'the first scientific text book' - in the light of modern research
